DESCRIPTION OF THE PLANNING PROCESS

Organization

A Comprehensive School Improvement committee of fifteen was formed consisting of staff, parents, students and community members. The new Comprehensive School Improvement Committee met for the first time on September 16, 2008 to begin the process of developing the Comprehensive School Improvement Plan. As a result of the first meeting subsequent meetings were held in which the committee members then discussed the district's mission statement, beliefs, external and internal factors pertinent to the development of the goals for the district. The committee also identified the district's strengths and concerns by reviewing the most recent data from the Missouri Assessment Program student scores, Annual Performance Report, Annual Secretary of the Board Report and the Osage R-1 School District Report Card. After examining these documents the committee recorded the strengths and concerns. From the concerns the committee then identified areas to target in our five-year plan for school improvement.

The areas selected were:

1. Student Achievement
2. Successful At-Risk Programs
3. Technological Advancements
4. Grounds and Facilities
5. Increased Parental and Community Involvement

The new Comprehensive School Improvement Plan was submitted for review by the Board of Education on February 11, 2015. The Board of Education adopted the new Comprehensive School Improvement Plan on February 11, 2015.

A. Leadership

The facilitator and district administration provided much of the leadership in developing the Comprehensive School Improvement Plan with valuable input by the staff, parents, students and community members.
